8. <u>Mayor and Council Reports - Appointments</u>

Minutes: The following was reported related to the Metro Flood Study Work Group:

- A Joint Powers Agreement has been drafted. The Moorhead City Council will discuss the elements of this document at the June 21, 2010 Committee of the Whole meeting.
- The US Army Corps of Engineers has noted that some downstream flood impact levels have been raised. There will be follow-up community meetings related to these new projections, including a public meeting in Hendrum, MN, on June 16, 2010.
- A delegation of Metro Flood Study Work Group members will visit Members of the Minnesota and North Dakota Congressional Delegations in Washington D.C. on June 28, 2010 to discuss the permanent flood protection project, advocate for its funding, and recognize those Members of Congress that have assisted in moving the project forward thus far.

It was noted that there are resident concerns related to the 34th Street and Interstate-94 interchange.

9. Permanent Flood Protection Discussion/Update

Minutes: A map was presented representing various bid awards for 2010 Flood Mitigation Projects by description and location. These projects are being funded through the Minnesota Department of Natural Resources, Flood Damage Reduction Grant Program.

10. <u>Public Hearing to Consider Submittal of a Grant Application to the Federal Transit</u>
Administration for 2010 Transit Operating, Planning, and Capital Assistance

Minutes: Public Hearing opened at 5:45 pm.

Lori Van Beek, Transit Manager, presented a brief overview of the grant application. The resolution to follow the public hearing would authorize submission of a grant application to the Federal Transit Administration for operating, capital, and planning projects.

In response to Mayor Pro Tem and Council questions, Van Beek stated the following:

- Allocated Federal funds can be carried over for up to three years.
 Care is taken to ensure the funds are fully utilized within this three year timeframe.
- A local share contribution is mandated to receive state grant funding for mass transit services. Federal funds cannot be utilized for this required match.
- The Metropolitan Council of Governments is the entity that designs goals for mass transit performance indicators.
- Van Beek outlined the calculation process for passenger mile statistics.
- The City of Dilworth's contribution is adjusted each month based on the number of riders on the Metro Senior Ride Service. The population of Dilworth is included with Moorhead in grant fund allocation.

No citizens addressed the Mayor Pro Tem and Council.

11. <u>Public Hearing to Consider the City's Stormwater Pollution Prevention Program (2009 Annual Report and 2010 Annual Meeting)</u>

Minutes: Public Hearing opened at 5:58 pm.

Bob Zimmerman, City Engineer, presented a brief overview of the Stormwater Pollution Prevention Program. The public hearing is a

requirement of the MPCA General Stormwater Permit for Small Municipal Separate Storm Sewer Systems. The information presented was conducted in Calendar year 2009 (fourth year of permit).

Ken Lucier, Moorhead resident, requested a definition of "pollution." Zimmerman stated that pollution is a broad term intended to represent anything that would negatively affect water quality.

Public Hearing closed at 6:03 pm.

12. Public Hearing to Consider Adoption of Assessments for Various Projects

Minutes: Public Hearing opened at 6:03 pm.

Michael Redlinger, City Manager, stated that this public hearing is held to adopt assessments for work performed by City Departments to addresses areas of neglect and unpaid fees/penalties in accordance with Moorhead City Code. The resolution to follow the public hearing would authorize the City of Moorhead to adopt assessments at these properties.

In response to Mayor Pro Tem and Council Member questions, City staff stated the following:

- The Rental Registration Program requires all rental property owners to register with the City. A single family property in a single family neighborhood is considered a commercial enterprise and is required to register. These properties are taxed at residential rates for City services, such as sanitation collection.
- City staff will provide a report to the Mayor and Council regarding Dutch Elm disease evaluation and the procedure to remove and assess any tree removal expense.
- Brian Neugebauer, City Attorney, provided a description of the properties required to register as a vacant property with the City. The State of Minnesota prevents the City from assessing more than anticipated City costs. Properties that meet all conditions of City Code are not required to register and are not assessed a fee.
- Scott Hutchins, Director of Community Services, stated that there is an annual registration process for vacant properties. Landlords with a good history can receive a discount. Overall, fee rates have been reduced due to property owner compliance.
- The current assessments under this resolution are being conducted as part of a penalty or violation. Owners have been provided with numerous reminders and are given ample opportunity to make corrections before the City seeks to adopt assessments.

The Mayor Pro Tem and Council Members noted the following:

 Vacant building fees could be discussed at a future Committee of the Whole meeting to review the impact of the ordinance, as it was originally adopted in 2004 with the current fee rates.

- Allowing single family homes to be used as a rental unit may create a disincentive for the construction of multi-family apartment buildings.
- Some property owners continue to be non-compliant despite current fees and penalties.

- The funding source for this project dictates that this allocation is to fund "transportation enhancement projects" to support alternative modes of transportation in a high use area.
- This project was identified as a need three years ago.
- The City of Moorhead competed with other cities and counties in Minnesota Department of Transportation (District 4) for these funds. If the project is not approved, the funding will be distributed to communities elsewhere.
- The 20th/21st Street and Main Avenue underpass project will very likely be built in phases due to the magnitude of construction costs.

 There are other essential City projects that have been prioritized over this project; however, the current funding structure does not allow them to get underway at this point.
