- Large outdoor sculpture – (i.e. giant animal or “Mr. Spud”)
- Iconic downtown sculpture/Downtown plan outcomes/Center Mall improvements
- Artistic embellishments to current planned capital projects (i.e. underpass art at 20/21st St and Downtown/11th St)

- Outdoor concert series at Woodlawn's Heritage Garden & Amphitheater
- Placemaking areas that could host events (i.e. performing arts space / open mic opportunities)
- Virtual spaces/virtual delivery /will public art change due to the pandemic?
- 150th Anniversary sculpture at river or other locations
